## Client Project

With natural gas exploration and production being high priorities for the Mexican Government, PEMEX, Mexico's state-owned oil and natural gas company, assumed the Burgos gas field exploration project in an effort to help Mexico meet the nation's rapidly expanding power generation requirements. In order to complete the project on schedule, PEMEX staff would be on-site all day and night, which made workforce camps and bunkhouses mandatory necessities.

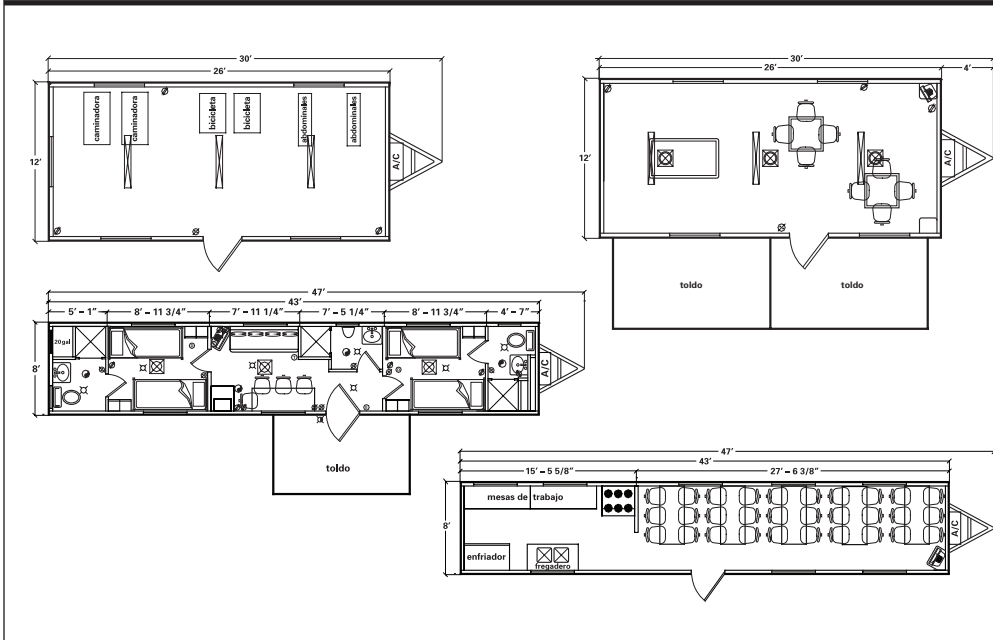

## Burgos Basin, Northern Mexico



### Client Need:

PEMEX hired Grupo Industrial Faja de Oro, S.A. to provide a complete workforce camp, including dorms, locker rooms, kitchen/dining area, exercise & recreational facilities, and medical/first aid facilities. The camp needed to be relocatable to move from drill site to drill site over a two-year period. PEMEX also needed to procure the facilities quickly. The PEMEX contract required Faja de Oro's services to be provided within 60 days of signing. The bid specifications originally called for an RV-type construction, but when the Mexican manufacturer received authorization to modify the bid specs to mobile/modular construction, Faja de Oro knew they could depend on Williams Scotsman to provide the mobile space to meet PEMEX's time schedule and project requirements for relocatability and function.

### The Williams Scotsman Solution:

In less than six weeks, Williams Scotsman supplied forty-one mobile space units to the PEMEX camps at Burgos Gas Fields. Each camp consisted of ten mobile units including, eight spacious dormitories complete with bunks and mattresses, a fully equipped kitchen/dining unit accommodating forty people, a game room with entertainment systems, and an exercise facility. An additional unit served as a centrally located facility for medical personnel and first aid services.

Since the camps were moved from site to site, Williams Scotsman's solution afforded mobile units with self-leveling jacks for convenience and ease of installation as well as reinforced axles and tires for anticipated wear and tear.

Williams Scotsman worked with Faja de Oro using an operating lease on over \$1 million of equipment, which enabled Faja de Oro to successfully augment operations to provide PEMEX with critical services.

### The Result:

As this was the first largest custom project in Mexico for Williams Scotsman, they were certain to use it as an opportunity to illustrate their long-term growth commitment to the Mexican market. They provided the products and services needed to meet the contractor's contractual obligations and PEMEX's project specifications.
