Client Project

Maricopa County Department of Public Health is located in south central Arizona. It offers more than 30 health related programs and services to a county population of almost four million. Among the many health programs Maricopa County offers to its residents is the Women, Infants and Children program (WIC). WIC is a Supplemental Nutrition program that provides nutrition education and support to pregnant women and new mothers with infants and children less than five years of age. The program's existing modular facility in Phoenix, AZ was in poor condition and needed to be replaced.

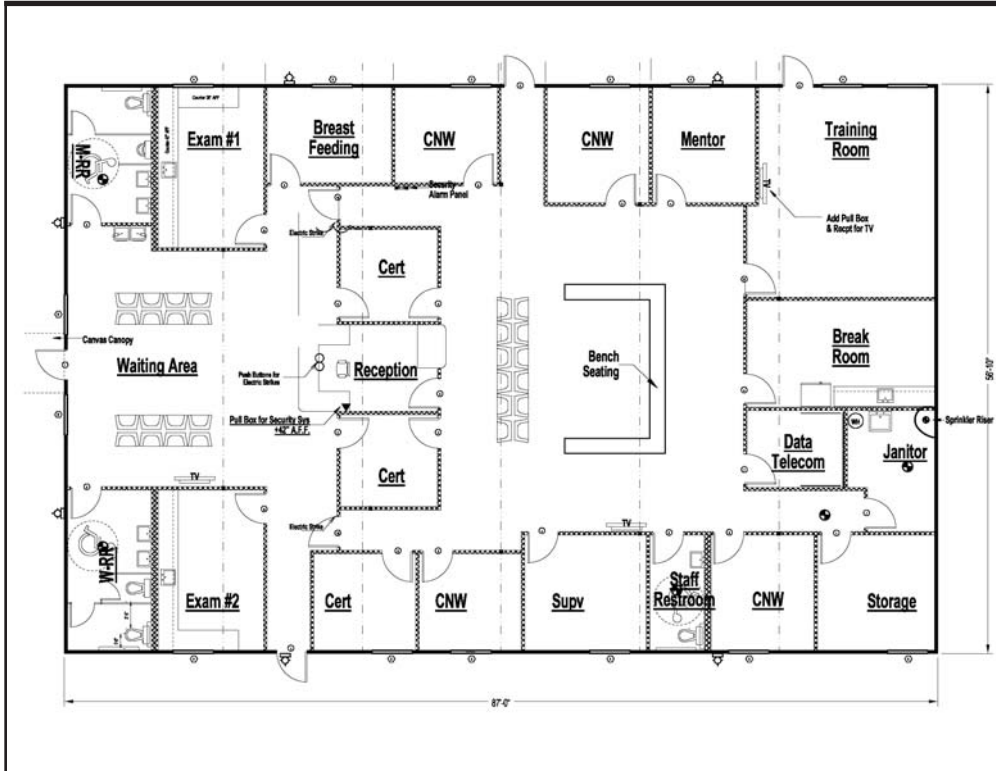
Client Need

Maricopa County's Facilities Management Department wanted to replace the existing structure with an updated modular building but with minimal disruption to ongoing operations. With a limited budget, urgent project timeline and narrow site restraints, Maricopa County contacted local General Contractor, Builders Guild, Inc for assistance in establishing the best team for the project. Due to their previous project relationship with Builders Guild, Inc and successful track history providing modular buildings similar in application, Williams Scotsman was selected as the modular building subcontractor.



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The Williams Scotsman Solution

Williams Scotsman offered a variety of preconstruction services including schematic design, space planning, budgeting and project scheduling. In order to accommodate the narrow site restraints, a combination of custom sized modules were delivered and crane installed at multiple pick points for maneuvering around existing trees. Also, careful collaboration with the Public Health and Facilities Management departments was incorporated to ensure the color scheme, finishes and building layout created a friendly and cost effective environment.

The Result

A new 4,928 square foot modular WIC center was completed on-time and within budget. The facility features classrooms, counseling/interview room, waiting area, break room, staff restrooms, reception area, storage room, and labs for conducting infant examinations.
